



JELLYFISH

This is a very versatile activity. Any of the materials can be substituted for something else. For example, if you don't want to use filmstrips for the jellyfish tentacles you can use tinsel strips, coloured cellophane etc. The silver paper is the same, you can use coloured paper, contact, stickers etc.

Materials: 1 Aerosol Can Lid (Like from fly spray or cooking oil cans), Film Strips, Silver Paper, Glue.

Method:

1. Cover or decorate your lid with silver paper.
2. Cut your film strips to the desired length and glue around the inner rim of the lid.
3. Add eyes.



UNDERWATER SCENE

This is an activity that can be done with any scrap materials you like to make a funky underwater scene.

Materials:

White styrofoam tray, coloured paper strips, stickers, paint, plastic shavings, shells, magazine pictures, glue.

Method:

1. Cut pictures from magazines or draw your Own. You might choose fish, sharks, coral, crabs, anything you like!
2. Design your own background or use a magazine picture, glue this to the inside of your tray.
3. We stuck shells and plastic shavings to the ocean floor with a hot glue gun. You could also use shells, seaweed or rocks.
4. Stick your creatures onto the background using PVA glue. We suspended some of ours, and stuck others out from the back wall with paper loops to make a more 3D effect.
